This painting was put on display when Highland High School was opened through the efforts of the artists son, James T. Harwood Jr., who later served as Vice Principal of the school from 1975-1981. The artist, James Taylor Harwood was born on April 8, 1860 in Lehi, Utah. He is notable among early Utah impressionists and is the first Utah artist to study in Paris, both at the Academie Julian and at the Ecole des Beaux Arts. He spent his teaching career in the Salt Lake City schools and served as chair of the University of Utah Art Department from 1923-1931.
