Highland High School Dress Code

In the interest of encouraging a positive school atmosphere, maintaining a disciplined and focused educational environment, and promoting student safety, Highland High School will have a dress code governing student dress at school and while participating in school-sponsored activities.

The dress code will ensure that all students are treated equitably regardless of gender/gender identification, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, religion, or any other protected class as well as body type/size and personal style. Compliance with this dress code rests primarily with the student and his or her parents or guardians. It is each student's responsibility to come to school dressed in a manner that supports a positive learning environment.

Allowable Dress & Grooming

1. Students must wear clothing, including both a shirt and bottom or appropriate one-piece outfit. As a minimum length, the bottom hem of a shirt must meet the waistband of the bottom garment.
2. Students must wear appropriate footwear at all times, such as shoes or sandals.
3. Shirts and dresses must have opaque (not see-through) fabric in the front, back, and on the sides.
4. Undergarments, breasts, buttocks and genitals may not be visible.
5. Hats and other headwear must allow the face to be visible and not interfere with the line of sight of any student or staff. Hoods must be worn off-the-head during class time.
6. Clothing must be suitable for all scheduled classroom activities including courses that may require specialized attire, such as physical education, science labs, wood shop, and any settings where unique hazards may exist. Teachers have the right to establish policies for individual classrooms.
7. Students participating in district or school-sponsored events which require temporary deviation from the dress code will not be penalized.

Non-Allowable Dress & Grooming

8. Clothing, accessories, tattoos or symbols (hereinafter referred to simply as "clothing") may not depict, advertise or advocate the use of alcohol, tobacco, marijuana or other controlled substances.
9. Absolutely no article of clothing, badge, lettering, sign, hairdo, jewelry, emblem, symbol or any other attire will be allowed at school that is intended, recognized or acknowledged to signify affiliation with, participation in, or approval of a gang. Examples include: belt buckles with letters or numbers,

forehead bandanas or bands, etc. For further clarification, see S-3, Gang Signs, Symbols, Signals, Words, and Conduct Prohibited.

10. Clothing may not depict pornography, nudity or sexual acts.
11. Clothing may not use or depict hate speech targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious affiliation or any other protected groups.
12. Students' attire, accessories, footwear or grooming may not threaten the health or safety of any other person. Examples include: metal spikes, wristbands or collars, excessively long belts left hanging out of belt loops, etc.

Administration of Dress Code

Accommodations/exemptions will be made for students with documented health or medical issues, religious beliefs, or for those who identify as intersex, transgender, and gender nonconforming that are substantially affected by the school's dress code.

Students who are in violation of the dress code will be given the option to wear clothing issued by Highland High administration, or to have compliant clothing brought to them from home. Clothing issued by Highland High administration that is not returned will be subject to a replacement fee or act of service in lieu of payment.
