Course Description

- **Shakespeare Competition & Showcase, Region/State Drama Competition & Showcase, Rams Act or Spring Production/Showcase**
- Approval/Prerequisite: Teacher/Passing Grade in Beginning Theatre
- Graduation Credit: 1.0 Fine Arts

Course Goals and Objectives

Advanced theatre allows performers to extend their abilities/experience and further their knowledge within the art of Theatre through:

1. competition & audition preparation
2. resume drafting, character and design analysis, and discussion with other designers & actors
3. in-depth acting, as well as directing, & producing

The Utah Education Network has developed curriculum which outlines specific standard for student learning in the theatre classroom which can be accessed through the UEN website at <http://www.uen.org/core/theatre/7-12.shtml>.

This class is also preparation and rehearsal time for various showcases and competitions throughout the school year including, but not limited, to Shakespeare, Region/State, and a Spring Production. This part of the class is performance based and will **require** OUTSIDE OF CLASS PARTICIPATION!

Course Materials

- There is no required textbook for this course; however, students may be required to obtain their own scripts and resources from the school library, public library, or retailer for in-class projects. We will draw from the small Theatre library of scripts and texts for daily scene work, research, and study of the performing arts. Exact titles will vary and depend on classroom needs.
- Film clips, movies, YouTube videos, and other productions may be viewed in this class. These items will be used to enhance student learning and may be rated G, PG, or PG-13. All PG-13 viewings will be carefully screened and appropriate for class. If any student is uncomfortable with PG-13 material, they may request an alternate assignment. Please contact me with any questions or concerns.

Format and Procedures

This class will include student performances (individual and group work) and academic study including research, writing, and discussion. Students will be graded on written tests as well as practical assessments. Other assignments may include portfolios, groups learning projects, reports, presentations, etc. Participation and attendance are key!

Course Requirements

- **PARTICIPATION:** Students are required to attend class regularly, be on time, and come prepared. Participation points will be awarded every day based on attendance, behavior, attitude, and participation.
- **ADVERTISING/PROMOTION:** Student will be expected to advertise, sell tickets, and contact possible supporters/donors for their productions.

- **COSTUMES & PROPS:** Students may also be responsible for obtaining and maintaining part or all of their personal costumes and props. *Pieces borrowed from the school closets must be **washed/dry-cleaned** before return to maintain cleanliness and quality.*
- **HIGHLAND P.A. VOLUNTEER HOURS:** Students are required to perform 5 Highland Performing Arts Service Hours per semester. These hours **MUST** be done at **HIGHLAND** (no outside hours will be accepted). Opportunities will be provided through the Highland Theatre department (ex: volunteering as ushers for performances, helping with the musical on build days, etc), but students can also assist with projects and performances with Highland Choir, Orchestra, Band, or Dance departments. These hours must be logged on the class form, signed for by a supervising teacher, and turned in before the semester deadline in both January and May.
- **PLAY REPORTS/PERFORMANCE ATTENDANCE:** Students are required to attend local or professional theatre performances and submit **2 Play Reports per semester**. These reports **MUST be accompanied with a Ticket or Program** from the performance for credit. These can include school, community, or professional plays or musicals, however, 1 exception per year can be made for attending a HIGHLAND Dance, Choir, Band or Orchestra concert.
- **Other assignments TBD** will be outlined in class.

Grading & Class Procedures

- Students are **expected to uphold Highland’s Expectations** regarding dress code, attendance policy, personal conduct, listening devices, electronics & phones. RESPECT is the key to any classroom environment. This means respecting the classroom, the teachers, your peers, and yourselves.
- Students are expected to be in class. *Attendance will directly affect participation points.* It is required that students attend classes and **Engage** when in attendance. **Participation** points will be awarded every day based on **Attendance**, behavior, and attitude, and is calculated as part of the term grade. If students are absent, they are responsible for scheduling time with the teacher *after school* to see what they missed.
- **Assignments** are due at the *beginning* of the class period each day. After that point, assignments are considered late. **Late work will be accepted for half credit.** No work will be accepted after the **Term Deadline**.

- Students may **Make-up Work** from *EXCUSED* absences within 1 week, after 1 week the assignment is considered **Late**. Students may NOT make-up assignments from any *UNEXCUSED* absences.
- **Plagiarism & Cheating** will not be tolerated and will result in an automatic fail (a **0** on the assignment with no option for makeup or extra credit) and administration involvement.
- **Extra Credit** will be accepted upon discretion *ONLY if all other classwork is completed and current.*

G-8: Parent/Guardian Permission for a Student to Operate a Private Vehicle for School Activities



REQUIREMENTS:

It is occasionally necessary for a student to drive a private vehicle to school activities. The following requirements apply for authorized use of private vehicles:

1. The activity is approved by the school principal for students who will need to leave the high school campus.
2. The student driver must have a valid Utah driver's license in order to qualify for transporting other students.
3. Students may not drive if they have had a conviction or an alcohol/drug related driving violation or more than two moving violations in the last 12 months.
4. Each driver must ensure that the vehicle has passed state-required safety inspections.
5. Each driver must have liability insurance coverage. This responsibility is not assumed by the district. Each driver must carry in the vehicle at all times the required insurance company and policy number identification card provided by the insurance company
6. This form must be kept on file in the school.
7. REMEMBER - The driver and all passengers must wear seat belts. It's the law.

G-8: Parent/Guardian Permission for Student to be a Passenger in a Private or Rental Vehicle



REQUIREMENTS

1. It is occasionally necessary for a student to be a passenger in a private or rental vehicle being driven by another student or adult driver to school activities. The following requirements apply for authorized use of private or rental vehicles:
2. The activity is approved by the school principal for students who will need to leave the school campus.
3. High school students may not transport children younger than high school age and must have the approval of the principal to transport other high school students.
4. Each driver must have a valid Utah driver's license in order to qualify for transporting students.
5. Students may not drive if they have had a conviction for an alcohol/drug related driving violation. Adult drivers may not drive if they have had a conviction in the past 10 years for an alcohol/drug related driving violation. No one may drive if they have had more than two moving violations in the last 12 months.
6. Each vehicle must have liability insurance coverage. This responsibility is not assumed by the district.
7. Drivers must ensure that the vehicle has passed state-required safety inspections.
8. It is the student passenger's or his or her parents' duty to confirm that the driver carries the required insurance. Information regarding the insurance company and policy number can be obtained from an insurance identification card provided by the company which must be carried in the vehicle at all times.
9. This form must be kept on file in the school.
10. REMEMBER - The driver and all passengers must wear seat belts. It's the law
